Subject Overview	This subject explores the concept of sustainability and its applicability and adoption in the events industry. The subject takes a holistic view of sustainability by investigating the economic, social and environmental impacts of events and the roles that a range of stakeholders play in delivering a sustainable event. Case studies are used to highlight the complex environments in which event organization occurs and that a host of political, social and economic forces are potentially involved in shaping the adoption of sustainable practices within any event.
