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Subject Overview

The ability to provide quality products and services both safely and within a mandated legal compliance framework involves a clear understanding of the obligations and duty of care relevant to operating a corporate hospitality services business. In this subject, students will study a range of relevant legal frameworks, industry standards, operational compliances requirements and codes of practices of direct relevance to a corporate hospitality services environment. Key areas include both federal and state occupational health & safety compliance, food safety, first aid, operational security and industry specific activities. Importantly students will investigate the overall Australian compliance framework and its various elements such as laws, regulations, standards, codes of practice and rules as they relate to the corporate hospitality services sector.
