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<b>Subject Overview</b>	In this subject students will be challenged to question their own definition of ethical behavior through the interrogation of personal values, assumptions, beliefs and expectations (VABE's). Current and emerging ethical issues affecting the industry will be considered from the perspective of a range of stakeholders to examine how individual, organisational and environmental factors shape ethical decision making. Through a bounded research project students will investigate different approaches for the evaluation of ethical behavior and the role of leadership and management functions.
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<b>Learning Outcomes</b>	Identify individual, organisational and environmental factors which impact ethical decision making
	Compare different approaches for evaluating ethical behaviour from the perspective of various stakeholders
	Evaluate the role of leadership in shaping ethical behaviour within organisations
	Analyse ethical dilemmas that may occur in a corporate hospitality context
	Undertake and present findings from bounded research activities
